Insurance

Riding is a dangerous sport and accidents can happen. The new year is a great time to review your insurance and to protect yourself should the worst happen. A good place to start, if you are a leisure rider, is the British Horse Society http://www.bhs.org.uk. Membership (Gold Membership) includes Personal Liability and Personal Accident insurance. However, this insurance only covers death, loss of a limb or sight and does not cover body injury or loss of earnings, which could be an important consideration if you run your own business. If this is the case, please check your existing insurance would cover any horse-related accidents. If a reader has found excellent coverage with an insurance firm please contact me and I will gladly pass on the advice in the next issue of The Horses's Mouth
